Chairmans Report



Hi all,

I hope this letter finds you all well.

Thanks to all who attended our meeting on the 20th Sept25, and the topic of the day was a demo talk about "the Principles of Design", by Hardus, even though very summarized (as requested by me) the level of detail and info was still very good, also many questions were asked, which shows that the attendees were interested. And going forward, this will be a regular feature at our meetings.

I have asked Hardus, to take the lead in helping members with their designing and such work, especially the newer members, and this will help with our preparations for competitions, Heinrich is also a very competent tree designer .

The meeting discussion of the day also revolved around the planning for the future New Talent competition being planned for next year 2026, and we will need to do more practical work with trees brought in for the meeting day, so please continue to bring more workable trees to meetings, as this will help you and everyone to learn.

At this time of year, the weather has been a bit uncertain, either hot & dry or blustery, with possible splashes of rain, so keeping an eye on watering your trees is essential, fingers crossed it will rain more soon. Try to keep all repotted trees sheltered from the hot wind and too much of the hot sun.

As the weather continues to heat up, everything should be sprouting like crazy now, and you should be working your way through all the pruning and trimming of your trees. Be careful not to over prune/trim though, as this will slow things down, you need the initial growth, try and allow all flowering to finish, and then trim, while keeping an eye on your size of tree.

For our 18th October meeting the topic will be, Root Over Rock, by Pieter, so please bring suitable cuttings (with roots), rocks, soil, string, plastic wrap, tie downs, tin foil, etc., and container to hold it, should be a great afternoon.

Another item that we need to discuss and agree on, are the choices being put forward to change our club logo, have a look at the WhatsApp pics and please, make your vote for the change (or any other proposals) or to keep the current one, we need to get this decided soonest as a club.

Thanks to Desiree for organizing the raffle table again, and please guys keep bringing some goodies for the next time as well.

Whether you're a beginner or experienced, this is a great opportunity to experiment, learn, and share ideas. Don't miss it.




September's meeting: Tree Design by Hardus




Irene Farm Show







On 30 August, the BRAT Top 10 event brought together some of the best bonsai trees in our community. Five trees were selected from each size category: under 300mm and over 300mm. It was a day of appreciation, learning, and celebration.

Jonathan took first place in the over 300mm category with a beautifully structured tree that stood out for its balance and presence. Oom Hennie placed third in the under 300mm category with a compact tree full of character and charm. Their winning trees will be shown in the photos below.

I also did a demonstration on Spekboom, a species I enjoy working with. It's hardy, forgiving, and full of personality. The demo was informal and relaxed.
